Dealing with the things from the past makes us more aware of the hidden ropes in the present and opens new perspectives on the problems existing in our society for centuries: discrimination, hate, indifference, radicalism. The tragedy of the Holocaust shows us what monstrous dimensions and consequences these social phenomena may have. It also shows that we need to do something today for this tragedy not to be repeated.

This year's edition of the German-Polish-Ukrainian educational project "Learning from History" focuses on the issue of hate speech in historical and contemporary perspectives. During this seminar the participants will have a unique opportunity to visit the State Museum Auschwitz-Birkenau, get to know about hate speech in the NS-propaganda in the 1930s, discuss contemporary forms of hate speech and the ways to counteract it. The poster-workshop in the final part of the seminar will help the participants to process the things seen and heard, learn to make posters and enjoy the team-work.
